English Grammar Reported Speech Rules

Reported Speech Rules in English. By Matthew Jones on July 6, 2020 in English Grammar. Talking about what someone else has already said, also known as reported speech, involves a few special grammar rules in English. How you form reported speech will largely depend on what was said and when it was said. Unfortunately, you can't always repeat back what you hear verbatim (using exactly the same words)!

Reported speech - Indirect speech He says, "We were in London for the first time." Direct speech He says (that) they were in London for the first time. Reported speech - Indirect speech Simple Past. The simple past tense usually changes to the past perfect in reported speech. Change of tenses

When we use reported speech, we are usually talking about the past (because obviously the person

who spoke originally spoke in the past). The verbs therefore usually have to be in the past too. For example: Direct speech: I've lost my umbrella. Reported speech: He said (that) he had lost his umbrella. Tense Changes in Reported Speech

Reported Speech (Indirect Speech): Definition, Useful ...

Direct speech: I like ice cream. Reported speech: She says (that) she likes ice cream. We don't need to change the tense, though probably we do need to change the 'person' from 'I' to 'she', for example. We also may need to change words like 'my' and 'your'.

Rules for reporting speech To get this kind of sentence right, there are four things you should keep in mind: The first rule is to choose a reporting verb and tense. When did the speech happen?

Reported speech: She asked me where Julie was. The direct question is the present simple of 'be'. We make the question form of the present simple of be by inverting (changing the position of) the subject and verb. So, we need to change them back before putting the verb into the past simple.

In the first sentence, I am conveying the activities of David in his (D) own words without changing it; it is called direct speech or we can say reporting speech. In the second sentence, I am using my own words to convey the activities of the speaker (D) to the audience. This we can say indirect speech or reported speech.

In indirect speech, the structure of the reported clause depends on whether the speaker is reporting a statement, a question or a command. Indirect speech: reporting statements

General rules for changing direct speech into indirect speech Omit all inverted commas or quotation marks. End the sentence with a full stop. If the verb inside the inverted commas/quotation marks is in the present tense, change it into the corresponding past tense.

Direct to indirect speech: General rules - English Grammar

Indirect/reported speech, on the other hand, does not have to be within quotes or reported word-to-word. In fact, unless one is relaying the exact words spoken, one should never use quotation marks. Indirect speech examples: She told us that she wouldn't be coming home that night. She told him that she was happy.
