In *The Pit and the Pendulum* Poe uses all the elements people were fond of: adventure, supernatural, horror, death, being helpless etc. He moves the sensibility of the reader and evokes a certain emotional reaction. In this term paper I am going to concentrate on how Poe achieved a certain effect with his story. First I will take a closer look at the prisoners constant escapes, point out that most of these escapes are unbelievable and try to find out what the aim of his torturers might be.
