Most of the commonly proposed "solutions" are simply not acceptable to most people. Many of these proposed solutions—like stopping the use of fossil fuels—require a sacrifice today in order to obtain an uncertain advantage in the far future. Therefore they are

politically infeasible in the modern world, which is marked by relatively short term thinking. Friel's able defense of Al Gore's *An Inconvenient Truth* against Lomborg's repeated attacks is by itself worth an attentive reading.

The Question of Limits

We have forgotten how to think about limits. Most philosophical approaches to the environment have focused primarily on the value of the natural world, the status of anthropocentrism and the Anthropocene, and the largely ethical questions of our impact on the world. Ultimately, *The Question of Limits* contends that the value of embracing limits extends beyond the environment and offers the potential to become a transformative social good. *The Question of Limits* will be of great interest to students and scholars working at the intersection of environmental studies, economics, intellectual history and philosophy.
